

**At Horatio Myer & Co Limited the following policy is endorsed by our Senior Management – Gordon Mitchell – Managing Director.**

'We at Horatio Myer endeavour to the best of our abilities to implement procedures so that we do not purchase any wood or wood fibre from the sources deemed as controversial such as the following categories describe:

- a) Illegally harvested wood;
- b) Wood harvested in violation of traditional and civil rights;
- c) Wood harvested in forests where high conservation values are threatened by management activities;
- d) Wood harvested in forests being converted to plantations or non-forest use;
- e) Wood from forests in which genetically modified trees are planted.

In the implementation of the following Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) standard:

- **Standard for company evaluation of FSC Controlled Wood – FSC-STD-40-005 (Version 2-1) EN 2006**

We also endorse the assessment of our product 'Micron Board' as being in the 'low risk' category according to the FSC Controlled Wood Standard. It is deemed as 'low risk' by Horatio Myer as it is entirely composed of 'post-consumer' waste which is constituted from the following waste streams. According to the FSC standard:

- **FSC Standard for sourcing Reclaimed Material for use in FSC Product Groups or FSC Certified Projects – FSC-STD-40-007 (Version 1-0) EN 2007**

#### **Waste Stream Sources**


**Post consumer fibre sources:**

- Domestic distribution;
- Retail and industrial.

**Within the above categories the more specific waste origins of material include:**

- Commercial transport packaging
- Computer print-outs
- Magazines, direct mail, home office material and boxes
- Old magazines from residential or office collections
- Old newspapers from residential or office collections
- Reclaimed household scrap paper and packaging, including old newspapers
- Reclaimed office waste paper
- Used corrugated boxes
- Used tabulating cards
